10. Have a blast!

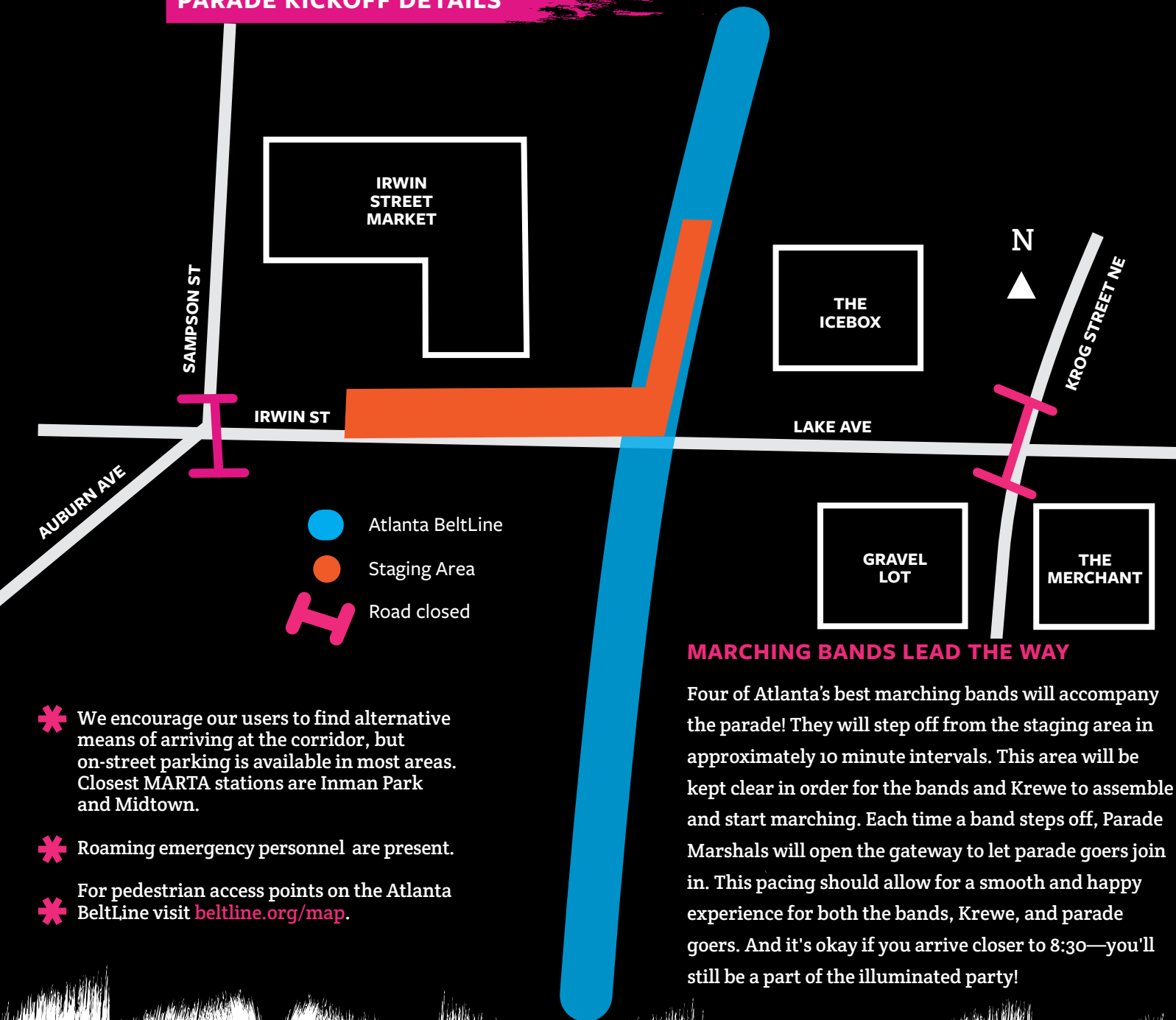

MARCHING BANDS LEAD THE WAY

Four of Atlanta's best marching bands will accompany the parade! They will step off from the staging area in approximately 10 minute intervals. This area will be kept clear in order for the bands and Krewe to assemble and start marching. Each time a band steps off, Parade Marshals will open the gateway to let parade goers join in. This pacing should allow for a smooth and happy experience for both the bands, Krewe, and parade goers. And it's okay if you arrive closer to 8:30—you'll still be a part of the illuminated party!

- * We encourage our users to find alternative means of arriving at the corridor, but on-street parking is available in most areas. Closest MARTA stations are Inman Park and Midtown.
- * Roaming emergency personnel are present.
